administration should review the structure to appoint a dedicated records manager for the district as part of legal compliance.

Our communities cannot afford mismanagement of funds, more-so in our Municipality. Our IDPs in **Sedibeng District Municipality** sets out a clear course of Action in this regard.

It is with great pride and humility that I announce that while everybody is losing their heads around us, raising red flags, making noises about the imminent collapse of the municipalities because of inability to manage finances and their records management, **Sedibeng District Municipality**, your Municipality and our home, has after stringent scrutiny, been duly conferred with **two prestigious titles as I alluded to earlier**

It is a great leap in the right direction for our District Municipality. This in the road to ensure continued sound financial standing, reflecting our commitment to visible service delivery. Our commitment to archives and

All the municipalities namely Sedibeng District Municipality, Bojanala Local Municipality, Greater Tzaneen with its local municipalities, Ekurhuleni Metro, Tshwane Metro and Johannesburg Metro were contestants in this category. With only three municipalities in the final round, being Sedibeng District Municipality, Ekurhuleni Metro and Greater Tzaneen Municipality, we, Sedibeng District Municipality were without equal, pronounced the best of the rest.

Madam Speaker, as I earlier alluded to, this we have achieved for safeguarding and preservation of records of the Council, ensuring that the end users, clusters, departments and the public can access, use and learn from them. **Colleagues**, I believe that you will agree with me when I say, these **Awards** pose a challenge on us as a **District Municipality** to
